Motion: #1

Motion: CADPAAC supports the Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs (ADP) as the single state agency/department for oversight of all AOD treatment services provided in licensed and certified facilities by certified AOD staff in California. CADPAAC further supports and requests that ADP facilitate a series of statewide meetings with all agencies/departments providing AOD treatment services, to begin as soon as possible over the next two years. These meetings should include, but not be limited to, the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR), CADPAAC, and treatment providers. The immediate goal is to discuss strengthening the role of ADP and its oversight of all Bay Area Services Network (BASN) and Parolee Services Network (PSN) services now and in the future.

Motion: #2

Motion: CADPAAC requests and strongly urges that the Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs (ADP) adopt a department policy that allows counties the flexibility to provide or negotiate provider contracts for residential services on a dedicated capacity bed-day basis, and that establishes the “standard of practice” utilization rate of 85% for audit purposes for all AOD public funds, including the Substance Abuse Crime Prevention Act (SACPA).

Motion: #3

Motion: CADPAAC requests and strongly urges that the Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs (ADP) adopt a department policy that allows counties the flexibility to provide or negotiate provider contracts for outpatient treatment services on a dedicated capacity basis, and that establishes the “standard of practice” utilization rate of 85% for audit purposes for all AOD public funds, including the Substance Abuse Crime Prevention Act (SACPA).

Motion: #4

Motion: That CADPAAC approve the proposed Like-Size County structure, with the following two conditions:

- (1) Sutter and Yuba Counties will be counted as one small county for the purposes of Like-Size County representation only, but will continue to pay separate dues as two MBA counties.
- (2) With the approval of the Association, a county may move up to the next larger size county group, provided that its population is reasonably close to the cut-off, and that it pay the larger county dues.
